In 1984, he established the Scott O'Dell Award for Historical Fiction, which is given each year to the best historical novel for children.

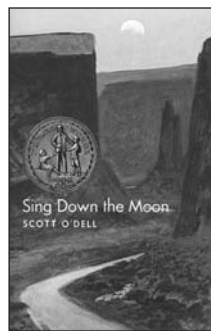
